Ongoing projects:

- Renovation and expansion of the Ennismore Community Centre and Ennismore Curling Club to improve accessibility and accommodate demand
- Renovation at the Lakefield Smith Community Centre including the construction of an elevator for accessibility
- Significant shoreline restoration at Isabel Morris Park work including installation of a pathway system and lighting, canoe launch area and native plantings
- Extensive waste diversion program that will see construction and demolition material diverted from the landfill to be recycle
- Development of a new comprehensive Zoning By-law and Official Plan
