Energy Conservation Tips and Tricks

- Get an Energy Audit or DIY: NRCan can help!
- Borrow an Appliance Monitor from the Ptbo Libra for FREE
- Purchase energy-efficient office equipment/appliances- Check to see if they are ENERGYSTAR-rated
- Reduce peak demand: stagger work hours & run appliances/updates during off-peak

Energy Conservation Tips and Tricks Continued...

- Program your thermostat
- Lower space and water temperature
- Use low-flow plumbing
- Use energy-efficient lighting (CFL or LED vs. incandescent)
- Use fans to circulate air, reducing strain on HVAC units
- Minimize "phantom load" (shut things down and unplug at end of day, e.g. printers, monitors, phone chargers, etc.

Energy Retrofit Grants & Incentives

<u>Save On Energy/IESO (via Hydro One)</u> *New Retrofit Program details released January 4, 2021. Webinar on new program Jan. 26th.

Retrofit Program: expanded list of eligible energy-efficient measures available under three streams: lighting, HVAC and manufacturing and other equipment.

Process & Systems Upgrade Program: larger, more complex projects.

Energy Performance Program: continuous whole-building energy improvements under the pay-for-performance model: paid for metered savings.

Small Business Lighting Program: up to \$2,000 in incentives for eligible lighting upgrades.

Peterborough Utilities (PDI)

Refrigeration Efficiency: receive up to \$2,500 in refrigeration upgrades for your business.

COVID Energy Assistance Program-Small Business: proportional amount of Provincial fund available to PDI small business and registered charity customers.

Enbridge/Union Gas

Equipment Incentive Program: Space Heating, Water Heating, Food Service-bonus for Water Heating & Food Service **Custom Engineering Incentive Program:** range of supports (50-66% incentives, up to \$10k-\$20k) for identifying natural gas savings, increasing energy efficiency knowledge and implementing measures)

Energy STAR Certification: high efficiency appliances. Look for the label!

Energy benchmarking

Energy STAR Portfolio Manager: energy management & tracking tool to measure and track energy and water performance of any building over time.

Customized Energy Consumption and Cost Tracking: Get in touch for support.

Energy Manager Programs: available through Save On Energy & Natural Resources Canada, funding for larger businesses to hire an Energy Manager. R&J Machine has a someone in a similar position.

Canadian Infrastructure Bank (CIB) Growth Plan: investing in five major initiatives: \$2.5 billion for clean power, \$2 billion in broadband connections for underserved communities, \$2 billion in large-scale energy efficiency retrofits, \$1.5 billion for agricultural irrigation projects.

Preparing for **Proposed** Federal Single-Use Plastic Ban

- The Federal government has a plan for zero-plastic waste by 2030
- As part of this plan they have been discussing banning single use plastics
- A plan was released in October 2020 listing the specific items that could be managed through a
- The government has announced the ban could come into play as early as 2021
- The plan may evolve as comments are received and considered so nothing is certain as of yet.
- Businesses should start to consider how they may adapt to these changes by considering alternative options to single use plastics

Recycling Regulation *Proposed* Changes

- Ontario government is making changes to the current Blue Box Recycling Program to make producers (brand owners) fully responsible for the recycling program and costs instead of municipalities and taxpayers
- Resource Productivity & Recovery Authority (RPRA) recently approved Stewardship Ontario's Wind-Up Plan of the Blue Box Program
- The regulation explains
- who will be eligible- residential units including multi-residential, schools, long-term care homes, and some public spaces
- what materials will be collected (the list is going to be expanded and standardized across the province)
- how the program will function (data collection and reporting of producers, etc.)
- Nothing is finalized yet wait for final regulations for changes

Recycling Regulation *Proposed* Changes

Ptbo & County transition 2024

- Over time municipalities have adapted their system to assist local businesses with separating and processing recyclables
- The inclusion of commercial establishments will be determined over the course of the next couple of years in consultation with service providers, businesses, and municipalities
- In Peterborough County the scheduled date for the service to transition to producers is 2024 - expect to see changes and communications leading up to this date on how your collection may be impacted by the new regulations

Relevance to Small-Medium Enterprises

- Don't worry! Changes don't happen overnight, there will be communication from your current Blue Box Recycling providers (Ptbo County)
- Ways you can prepare: support circular economy, reducing reliance on plastics, the 4 Rs (refuse, reduce, reuse, recycle), independent recycling services, container deposits, and diversion programs to make sustainable waste management choices
- Submit questions and provide input to the RPRA and Stewardship Ontario
