For those interested in running for the 2022 Municipal or School Board Elections, nominations may be filed at the Municipal Office (1310 Centre Line, Selwyn) **from May 2nd, 2022 to August 19th, 2022 until 2:00PM**

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

The 2022 Municipal & School Board Election takes place October 24th, 2022 and we encourage Selwyn residents to exercise their right to vote!

How do I "cast" my ballot?

The Township of Selwyn will, once again, be offering internet and telephone voting! Eligible electors will be able to vote anytime within the voting period using a mobile device, computer, telephone, cell phone, iPad, or laptop. To check out a 'how-to' video, visit the Township website!

Selwyn residents will receive a personalized Voter Information Letter (VIL) which will have details on how to vote online or by phone. The VIL provides the web address or toll free phone number for people to use for voting. It also has a personalized PIN # that will be needed in order to vote. The elector will also be asked for their year of birth as a further security measure. All votes are encrypted for security and secrecy purposes.

When is the voting period?

Voting will be available starting on October 11th at 10:00 AM and will be available 24/7 until Election Day - October 24th with voting ending at 8:00 PM.

How do I vote if I don't have a computer or telephone?

Computers and telephones will be available at the Municipal Office (1310 Centre Line, Selwyn) during the voting period for public use:

- October 11th: 10:00AM to 4:30PM
- October 12th to 21st: 8:30AM to 4:30PM (weekdays only)
- October 24th: 8:30AM to 8:00PM

Also, public computers are available at all three Selwyn Public Library branches during regular hours of operation. (*Note: technical and voting "how-to" support is **not** available at these locations*)

- Ennismore branch: 551 Ennis Road, Ennismore
- Lakefield branch: 8 Queen Street, Lakefield
