

Let's Be Clear

Sorting Guide

Selwyn Township is launching a new Clear Bag Program. This program will have a positive impact on keeping waste out of the landfill and protecting our environment.

Dates to Remember

March 1st, 2020: Clear Bag Program Begins

Start using clear bags for garbage.

September 1st, 2021: Clear Bag Program Becomes Mandatory

Garbage in opaque bags will be refused.

Let's Get Started...

- If you currently use an opaque bag for garbage...

Start using a clear bag for garbage on **March 1st, 2020**.
Clear bags will be mandatory starting **September 1st, 2021**.

For residential curbside pickup, you are permitted two (2) clear garbage bags. For commercial curbside pickup, you are permitted four (4) clear garbage bags.

Place recyclables in blue boxes.

Place your clear garbage bags and recycling boxes at the curb by 7am on pick up day.

If you use a container...

- Ensure that there is no recycling in the container
- If you put your opaque bag inside a container, start using a clear bag

This Program Becomes Mandatory on September 1st, 2021.

Recyclables

The following recyclable items **MUST** be placed in Blue Boxes. All materials **MUST** be emptied, rinsed and loose.

Blue Box #1 - Papers & Plastic Bags

Boxboard:

- Drink & coffee trays
- Egg cartons
- Food boxes (e.g. granola bars, cereal)
- Shoe boxes
- Paper towel rolls/toilet paper rolls

Cardboard:

- Corrugated boxes
- Clean Pizza boxes

Mixed Paper:

- Computer paper & loose leaf
- Construction paper
- Envelopes
- Glossy paper
- Magazines & catalogues
- Newspapers & flyers (plastic delivery bags removed)

Plastic Bags:

- Grocery, milk, bread bags, plastic bottle/can wrap, soil & water softener bags (with handles removed), and newspaper bags (place all bags in one tied bag and place with papers)



Blue Box #2 - Containers

Paper Containers:

- Coffee cups & take-out drink containers (lids and straws removed)
- Milk/juice cartons & boxes
- Cans (e.g. chips, nuts, frozen juice)

Plastic Containers:

- Beverage containers (e.g. pop & water bottles, juice jugs, yogurt drinks)
- Food containers & bottles (e.g. mayonnaise, ketchup, peanut butter)
- Household cleaner bottles (e.g. glass cleaner, laundry detergent)
- Toiletry bottles (e.g. dish soap, shampoo, over-the-counter medication bottles)
- Plastic trays & clamshells (e.g. baked goods, fruit, sandwiches)
- Plastic tubs & lids (e.g. butter, sour cream, yogurt, ice cream tubs)

Metal containers:

- Aluminum cans (e.g. pop)
- Disposable foil containers (e.g. pie plates & food trays)
- Steel & tin cans and lids (e.g. soup, tuna)
- Empty aerosol cans & empty paint cans
- Aluminum foil

Glass Containers:

- Glass jars (e.g. jam, salsa, pickles)

Garbage

Sometimes mistaken as recyclable, these items are considered to be garbage:

- Liners from cereal & cracker boxes
- Bottle caps
- Bubble envelopes/wrap
- Candy & granola bar wrappers
- Chip & snack bags
- Coffee pods (e.g. K-cups)
- Plastic cutlery
- Individual condiment packages
- Plastic wrap
- Coffee lids & straws
- Dirty paper napkins & paper towels
- Dirty tissues
- Wax paper

Other garbage items:

- Diapers
- Food waste
- Kitty litter/pet waste
- Sharp objects (e.g. broken glass) in a puncture-proof container
- Styrofoam (e.g. meat trays & take-out containers)

One Small Privacy Bag
(non-transparent) May Be
Placed **Inside** Each
Clear Bag/Container

These items are garbage but there are other options for disposal:

- Soiled clothing, blankets & bed sheets (clean items should be recycled through donations or textile recycling)
- Ceramic dishes
- Broken Toys (plastic, wood, metal)
- Broken Laundry baskets & hampers
- Pet food bags (can be recycled at Village Pet Food & Supply locations)

Donate

Before throwing away used household items and clothing, think about where they could be donated and re-used instead!

Household items such as furniture, kitchen supplies, appliances, electronics, lighting, etc., in working condition can be donated to:

- The Salvation Army
- St. Vincent De Paul's (Vinnie's)
- Habitat for Humanity Re-Store
- Value Village
- Talize



Used clothing (not torn or stained) & accessories can be donated to:

 - Renewed Classics in Lakefield
- The Salvation Army
- St. Vincent De Paul's (Vinnie's)

Re-usable building materials can also be donated to the Habitat for Humanity Re-Store. They may even pick it up for you!

Other Ways to Divert

The following are examples of materials that can be disposed of separately from your garbage:

- Scrap Metal ^S
- Construction & Demolition Debris ^S
- Used Tires ^S
- Waste Electronics ^{S P}
- Used Batteries ^{S P}
- Household Hazardous Waste ^{S (seasonal)}
- Hard Plastics ^{S (seasonal)}
- Leaf & Yard Waste ^S
- Textile Recycling ^P
- Bulky Styrofoam ^P

^P = Pido Road

These diversion programs are available at the City of Peterborough's Material Recycling Facility (390 Pido Road, Peterborough).

^S = Selwyn Landfill

These diversion programs are available at the Selwyn Township Landfill site (1480 County Road 18) year-round.

FAQs (Frequently Asked Questions)

What if there are items in my garbage I do not want other people to see?

One (1) small “opaque privacy bag” can be placed inside each clear bag for personal items, such as sanitary products, diapers, incontinence products, pet waste, or other personal items. These opaque bags are similar in size to a grocery bag.

What if I use a container for curbside garbage?

You can keep using your container, just make sure that there is no recycling in it. If you use opaque bags in a container, start using a clear bag. You can use an opaque bag (grocery-sized) for privacy items.

What do I do with my left-over opaque garbage bags?

Any leftover opaque bags can be used for future clothing donations or donated to friends/family not in a jurisdiction requiring the use of clear bags. Clear bags will not be strictly enforced until **September 1, 2021**.

What happens if I do not use a clear garbage bag after September 1, 2021?

Starting September 1, 2021 clear garbage bags will be mandatory. If an opaque bag is used it will not be picked up at the curb or accepted at the landfill. Remember you can still have your small opaque bag for privacy inside the clear bag.

What retailers sell clear garbage bags?

Clear garbage bags may be purchased at most places that carry opaque bags. Local retailers that sell clear garbage bags can be found on our website.

Do clear plastic garbage bags cost more than traditional black plastic bags?

Both clear and black plastic garbage bags are made from the identical materials but without colouring added, so the suggested retail price should be similar.

What if I have a special medical circumstance and need a larger privacy bag?
