



#### Getting to Selwyn

By Road: Quick and convenient access to Highway 7, 28, 115 and 407. A new rural bus route called "The Link" offers public transportation between Selwyn, City of Peterborough and Curve Lake. Bus transportation is available in Peterborough and along Highway 115 via GO Bus, Greyhound and Coach Canada.

> By Air: The Peterborough Municipal Airport owned by the City Peterborough, provides business and travel charter services. Canada's largest airport, Pearson International Airport is conveniently located only 1.5 hours away via Highway 407.

By Water: Trent Severn Waterway is designated as a Canadian Heritage River System. It is serviced by a system of locks connecting Lake Ontario north towards Georgian Bay. The Trent Severn Waterway passes through our Township, with locks at Young's Point, Lakefield, and Buckhorn.





#### Savage Arms




#### Peterborough Regional Health Centre (PRHC)



#### **Innovation Cluster**



## Communities of **Selwyn**

Bridgenorth

A residential community on beautiful Chemong Lake amid a largely rural landscape. Bridgenorth offers shopping and services to meet the daily needs of residents and tourists. Bridgenorth has lands suitable for a variety of residential and commercial development.

#### Lakefield

Located along the Otonabee River, Lakefield is an urban community of approximately 2,500. It is Selwyn's largest commercial area and offers municipal water and sewer services. Lakefield has lands suitable for a variety of residential, commercial and industrial development.

#### **Ennismore**

An agricultural, family-oriented community with farms and lakeside homes and cottages. Ennismore is bordered on three sides by Chemong Lake, Buckhorn Lake, and Pigeon Lake. Ennismore is a focal point for community sports, recreation, and social events.

#### Buckhorn

This tourism area is rich in culture with its many art galleries, antique stores, cultural events, and attractions. According to Parks Canada, Lock 31 in Buckhorn is the busiest in Ontario.

#### Young's Point

Home to Lock 27 on the Trent-Severn Waterway, Young's Point is a key destination for thousands of cottagers in search of shopping, restaurants, and marinas.

#### Education & Healthcare

Selwyn's vast amenities include four elementary schools (two public and two Catholic) and one private high school. The community has two Family Health Teams, an Optometrist, Chiropractors, and Dentists.


