Let's Get Started...

- Clear bags are mandatory in Selwyn Township
- For residential curbside pickup, you are permitted two (2) clear garbage bags.
- Place recyclables into separate blue bins with containers in one and both papers and fibres in another.
- Place your clear garbage bags and recycling boxes at the curb by 7:00 am on pick up day.
- Each container/clear bag for garbage can include one (1) grocery sized privacy bag

DO NOT Bag Recyclables!

For curbside recycling pickup, you are permitted as many blue bins as you need!

Each container/clear bag cannot weigh more than 30 pounds (including privacy bag)



Recyclables

Blue Box #1 – Papers & Fibres

Boxboard:

- Drink & coffee trays
- Egg Cartons
- Food boxes (ex. granola bars, cereal)
- Shoe Boxes
- Paper towel rolls/ toilet paper rolls

Cardboard:

- Corrugated boxes
- Clean Pizza boxes

Mixed Paper:

- Paper laminate packaging, including pet food bags
- Computer paper & loose leaf
- Construction paper
- Envelopes
- Glossy paper
- Magazines & catalogues
- Newspapers & flyers (plastic delivery bags removed)

Flexible Plastics:

- Grocery, milk, bread, and newspaper bags
- Soil and water softener bags
- Plastic overwrap (paper towel & toilet paper)
- Coffee bags and deli pouches
- Chip bags and snack wrappers
- Bubble wrap
- Cereal bag liners
- Plastic gift bags
- Individual condiment packages
- Plastic wrap
- Wax paper
- Zipper type plastic bags (e.g. ziploc bags)



Recyclables

Blue Box #2 – Containers

Cartons & Cups:

- Coffee cups & take-out drink containers
- Milk/juice cartons & boxes

Plastic Containers:

- Beverage containers (e.g. pop & water bottles, juice jugs, yogurt drinks)
- Food containers & bottles (e.g. mayonnaise, ketchup, peanut butter)
- Household cleaner bottles (e.g. glass cleaner, laundry detergent)
- Toiletry bottles (e.g. dish soap, shampoo, over-the-counter medication bottles)
- Plastic trays & clamshells (e.g. baked goods, fruit, sandwiches)
- Plastic tubs & lids (e.g. butter, sour cream, yogurt, ice cream tubs)
- Tubes (toothpaste tubes, deodorant, hand cream)

Metal Containers:

- Cans (e.g. pop, chips, nuts, frozen juice)
- Disposable foil containers (e.g. pie plates & food trays)
- Steel & tin cans and lids (e.g. soup, tuna)
- Empty aerosol cans & empty paint cans
- Aluminum foil

Glass Container:

- Glass jars (e.g. jam, salsa, pickles)
- Clear and coloured glass jars, bottles, and containers

Foam Packaging:

- Meat trays
- Takeout containers – cups, plates, bowls
- Foam packaging for products



Garbage

- Dirty paper napkins and paper towels
- Tissues
- Books
- Diapers
- Food waste
- Kitty litter/pet waste
- Sharp objects (e.g. broken glass) in a puncture-proof container
- Soiled clothing, blankets & bed sheets (clean items should be recycled through donations or textile recycling)
- Ceramic dishes
- Toys (plastic, wood, metal)
- Laundry baskets & hampers

Organics

Household Composting:

Composters, digesters and kitchen catchers are available for purchase at the Selwyn Township Municipal Office and at the Peterborough County Infrastructure Services Department Office (310 Armour Road, Peterborough).

Peterborough County Organics Program:

Peterborough County has organic waste drop-off locations at transfer stations in North Kawartha, Trent Lakes, Cavan-Monaghan, Havelock-Belmont-Methuen, and Douro-Dummer. This is open to all County residents. A curbside green bin program is also available on a pilot basis to Bridgenorth residents.

Household Hazardous Waste

The Household Hazardous Waste Depot is open Tuesdays (9 AM - 5 PM) and Saturdays (9 AM - 3 PM) from June until Labour Day.

- Soap and Toiletries
- Batteries
- Chemicals
- Fluorescent Light Bulbs/Tubes

Leaf and Yard Waste Collection is offered through Peterborough County for certain areas in Selwyn Township. For residents outside of the pick-up areas, leaf & yard waste can be dropped off at the Township Landfill free-of-charge during the curbside collection time frame only.
